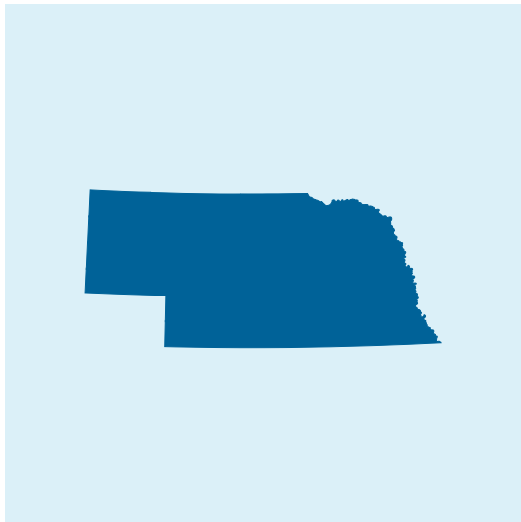


QUICK FACTS
