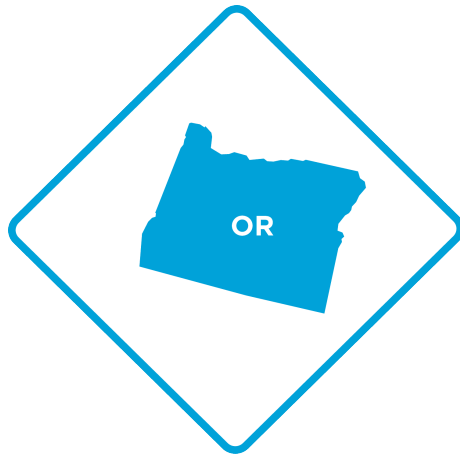


NIH FUNDING AT WORK IN OREGON



QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$417 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2023 that directly supported **5,013 JOBS**² and **\$992 MILLION**² economic activity in Oregon.
